**DESCRIPTION:  
IASA TITLE I**

The main goal of Title I is to improve educational opportunities for children who are at risk of failing in school. Title I services are provided to eligible children in public and nonpublic schools. Approximately 120 nonpublic schools also receive Title I services. More than 300,000 nonpublic school pupils may participate in the fiscal 2002 project.

The goals of the Title I, Title IV, and Class-Size Reduction projects support services for public school children and more than 80,000 nonpublic school children in Chicago. Following is a brief description of each of the four projects:

**IASA TITLE II**

The purpose of the District Professional Development Program is to provide professional development opportunities for teachers and administrators in those critical curricular areas. Local schools will design the professional development activities that will best meet their needs.

**IASA TITLE IV**

The purpose of the District Professional Development Program is to provide professional development opportunities for teachers and administrators in those critical curricular areas. Local schools will design the professional development activities that will best meet their needs.

The funding period for the four projects is July 1, 2001, through June 30, 2002.
