Persons who have been elected to serve on a Local School Council

and whose term begins during the school year following the election

pursuant to Section 34-2.1(f) of the Illinois School Code (105 ILCS 5/34-2.1(f)) have cleared a crimin

al conviction or convictions they have not been convicted of, as enumerated in Section 34-2.1(h) of the

Illinois School Code, of which a person is either permanently ineligible for election to or

**Disclosure**

**Criminal Conviction Disclosure Form**

All candidates must file a Criminal Conviction Disclosure Form prior to election. A Board conducted

All candidates

A person who has been convicted of any of the following offenses within the 10 years prior to the date of nomination or appointment shall be ineligible for election or appointment to a local school council:

Controlled Substance Trafficking, Criminal Drug Conspiracy, and Street Gang Criminal Drug Conspiracy.

**Termination by the Declaration of Vacancy, Office of School and Community Relations**

The General Counsel Office of School and Community Relations shall declare a vacancy on the

Animal Programs      Appeals Process

Within thirty (30) days of the determination of the Comptroller's Second Office of Scholastic Honor, the student may file a written appeal with the Comptroller's Second Office of Scholastic Honor. The Comptroller's Second Office of Scholastic Honor may accept or reject the appeal. If the appeal is accepted, the Comptroller's Second Office of Scholastic Honor may declare the student eligible to receive the degree. If the appeal is rejected, the Comptroller's Second Office of Scholastic Honor may declare the student ineligible to receive the degree.

## Appointment to Vacancy

If the challenged parent or community member is found to be ineligible to serve on the council, the Board shall fill the vacancy by appointment of a qualified person who meets the eligibility requirements. If a challenged teacher USC member is determined to be ineligible to serve on the council and a successor cannot be found, the Board shall fill the vacancy by appointment of a person whom meets the applicable requirements and is a member of the advisory roll of school staff.
