REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS:

The Board of Education has approved an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with the Chicago Fire Department, Chicago City Colleges of Chicago, the Chicago Police and Fire Training Academy (CPFTA) Program, and the Chicago Police and Fire Training Academy (CPFTA) Program. The CPFTA Program has been in operation since November 1998. The participating parties now wish to modify the program and this IGA is currently being developed. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind if a written IGA is not executed within 120 days of the date of this Board Report.

Approve entering into an intergovernmental agreement with the Chicago Police Department and City Colleges of Chicago for the CPFTA Program. The CPFTA Program has been in operation since November 1998. The participating parties now wish to modify the program and this IGA is currently being developed. Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2003, and shall remain in effect until such time as all the parties deem it necessary to discontinue the CPFTA Program.

TERM: The term of this agreement shall be for a period of four years.

CPFTA PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The CPFTA after-school and summer program provides instruction in a police and fire curriculum specifically focused on preparing students to embark on careers in public safety and law enforcement. CPFTA is a 4-year program; the first two years occur when students are high school juniors and seniors; the remaining two years constitute the college phase of the program. In addition to the high school and college training, students participate in summer internships that are designed to promote students' understanding of all aspects of police officer and firefighter careers. The program is open to all high school students living in the city of Chicago, whether registered at CPS or elsewhere. A maximum of 300 high school juniors and 180 seniors participate in the program annually. Successful students that complete all four years of the program will be eligible to test for entrance into the Chicago Police and Firefighter Training Academy.

CPS CONTRIBUTIONS:

The City of Chicago will contribute to the CPFTA program in the following ways: 1) provide all funds for program expenses; 2) provide a city-wide program coordinator; 3) fund two paid summer internships for all student participants; and 4) fund uniforms and field expenses for all high school cadets.
