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PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: College Bridge is a program designed to identify well qualified and highly motivated CPS high school juniors and seniors and to encourage them to pursue a college

education. The students are dually enrolled in the Chicago Public Schools and in one of approximately 100 courses available at local colleges and universities, receiving both high school advance placement course credit and undergraduate college credit. Courses in behavioral/social sciences, science, English, foreign languages, math, computer science, and fine arts are offered. In addition, each university provides a program of individualized counseling and support for the high school students. The number of participating CPS students estimated per university is calculated
