THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

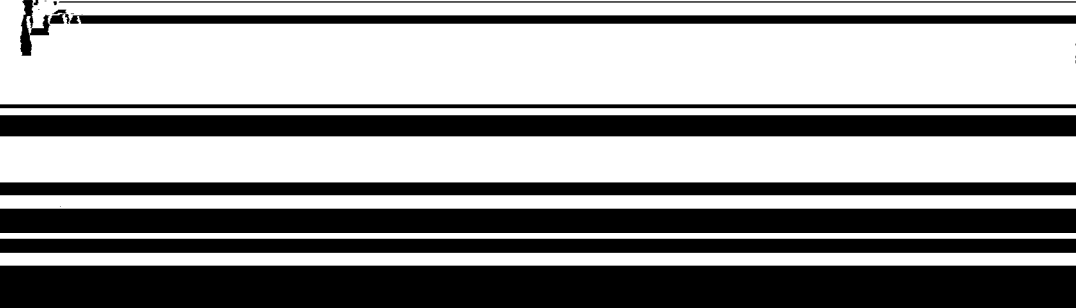
Authorize the acceptance of the following grants from the following sources for the following users:

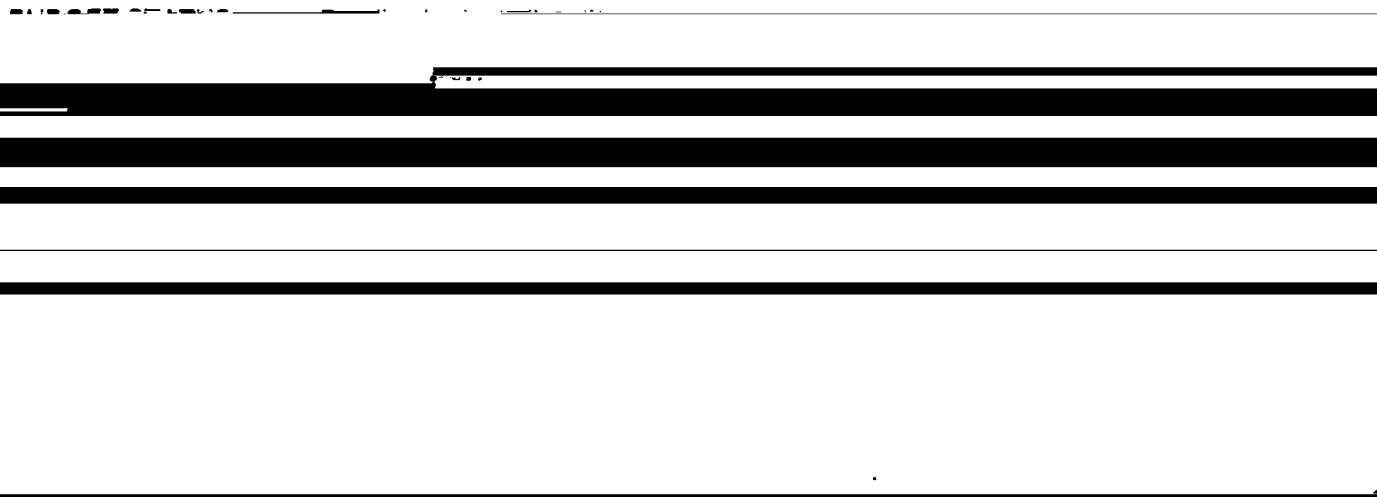
